Count Me In! (Inclusion) presented by *Cody Parham*. This training provides general information on how to successfully include each and every child in their learning environments. This training also increases the understanding of the laws surrounding inclusion and how to seek additional support for children who may be eligible for Early Intervention or Preschool Special Needs programs.

Cultural Diversity in the Classroom presented by *Bobbie Lee*. Come learn the concept of personal culture and how language, culture and family can connect to positive outcomes for children.

Directors: Leadership Development – Making the Most Out of Meetings (from the Director's Toolbox Series) presented by *Bobbie Lee*. Meetings are the glue that holds organizations together. Early childhood organizations are no exception. Come learn some piratical tips and strategies on meetings.

Directors: Intro to Practice Based Coaching presented by *Bobbie Lee*. This session will introduce you to the Practice Base Coaching model and will discuss why professional development alone will not produce better teaching practices but coupling professional development w/coaching will. Come add to your tool-box.

Healthy Starts (Nutrition) presented by *Arielle Weekley*. This session is taught by a registered dietitian from Richmond County schools. We will examine methods to incorporate farm to school initiatives and local food education in early childhood settings, highlighting the importance of healthy behaviors at early ages.

I Can Do It! You Can Do It! (Special Needs) presented by *Cody Parham*. In this training, participants will explore strategies for making adaptations in order to help children be successful. Using the adaptation continuum in the Cara's Kit, participants will identify the process for choosing adaptations. Hands on practice to identify adaptations using the GELDS toolboxes will give the participant strategies for adapting lesson planning.

Magic Carpet Ride: Language and Literacy presented by *Wanda Shryock*. Come join us for a magical carpet ride through the curriculum as we use literature and music to explore math, science, language arts, and social studies. The workshop will include 2 to 3 make and take projects.

ECDC 2019 SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

Magic Carpet Ride: Math presented by *Wanda Shryock*. Come join us for a magical carpet ride through making everyday math fun. We will explore making numbers come alive and fun so math is not dreaded or disliked. We will look at using hands on materials, music, books, and other resources, and your own excitement.

Magic Carpet Ride: Science presented by *Wanda Shryock*. Come join us for a magical carpet ride through science. We will look at using experiments, fieldtrips, resources and some downright messy exploring and your own excitement.

Nutrition: What Are You Feeding Me? presented by *Consuela Carter*. Nutrition is a key component to children's holistic healthy development. The goal of the workshop is to assist practitioners in understanding the importance of proper nutrition and how to incorporate it in the classroom while sharing information with parents.

On TRACK with Music and Movement presented by *Jason Jacobs*. We'll explore why music and movement matter and how anyone can make them happen every day!

Positive Behavior Supports: Instilling Behaviors of Self Control presented by *Consuela Carter*. This course offers best practices that will guide positive guidance techniques to instill self-control in children and early childhood practitioners.

Power of Language (Infant/Toddler) presented by *Annie Blair*. Participants will develop an understanding of the importance of building early language skills. Understand the importance of relationships for language development and to understand the elements of responsive interactions. This content lays the foundation for all other learning.

Puppetry Path Leading to Reading presented by *Dr. Paulette Harris*. This session will use a new book published on using puppets to enhance teaching reading to young children. Learn how to do just that in this hands-on session.

Read with Me (Infant/Toddler) presented by *Annie Blair*. The participants will gain the knowledge and benefits of reading books interactively while building relationships; language skills; expanding world knowledge; exposing children to other cultures, and teaching book-related behaviors, incorporating the TIPS

strategy. Most importantly, this presents opportunities for educators to make connections that will be specific to each child.

Rough Play: Problems and Possibilities in the ECE Setting presented by *Jason Jacobs*. Is it bullying or play? Is it safe or dangerous? Should I allow it or not? What's normal? Find out the answers to these questions and more!

Servsafe: Food Safety in the Kitchen (Cooks/Nutrition) presented by *Monica Cain*. This workshop will provide an overview of food safety in the kitchen including: foodborne illnesses, food allergens, personal handwashing, food cooking and serving temperatures, cleaning and sanitizing.

Standards 101: How to Use the GELDS presented by *Leslie Lewis*. This training introduces teachers to the Georgia Early Learning and Development Standards (GELDS) and explains how they can use the standards to improve learning outcomes. It provides an overview of the organizational structure and language and explains how the GELDS can be used to support developmentally appropriate practices.

Teaching Strategies for Quality Interactions presented by *Leslie Lewis*. Workshop reiterating ten teaching strategies for quality interactions, giving participants opportunities to identify strategies, improve specific interaction scenarios, and practice these strategies for skill refinement.

The Purpose and Power of Play-Based Learning presented by *Jason Jacobs*. Good play works wonders in the lives of young children! We'll discuss the best practices that ignite curiosity, fuel learning and make teaching and learning fun!

Understanding and Minimizing Challenging Behaviors (Teachers) presented by *Consuela Carter*. This session is designed to offer suggestions that will help minimize challenging behaviors and create a place of fun exploration for all children. Discussed are, biting, spitting, climbing furniture, and hitting. Educators are given the theory of why these behaviors take place and activities that allow the child to exhibit these behaviors without being reprimanded.
