
#### Free Online Training Registration

- 2. Choose "Trainings/Find Scheduled Training Sessions"
  - a. Search for the training title as listed in the Training Calendar.
- 3. Register for selected training session.
- 4. You will receive confirmation and reminder emails from GaPDS.
